Minutes of meeting held on 24th March, 2022 chaired by Secretary (Sports) to consider the proposal of ACTC for the discipline of Basketball for the year 2022-23.

A meeting to finalize the Annual Calendar for Training and Competition for the discipline of Basketball for the year 2022-23 was held on 24th March 2022 at 3:50 PM under the chairpersonship of Smt. Sujata Chaturvedi, Secretary (Sports) MYAS at the Conference Hall, Sports Authority of India HQ, New Delhi. The list of participants is at annexure I.

2. At the outset, Secretary General, BFI listed the projected targets for Basketball, and submitted the following measurable outcomes:

- 3. BFI presented the plans for the National Coaching Camps and Foreign Exposures. The budget summary was presented thereafter in accordance with the latest norms for funding under Assistance to NSF Scheme.
- 4. Secretary General, BFI made following commitments, which were included as binding decisions as part of approved ACTC calendar and budget:
 - 4.1 Gender Budgeting to be done so as to ensure equal expenditure for Men and Women.
 - 4.2 Strengthening and capacity building in National Camps through inclusion of Sports Science Staff and ensuring scientific evaluation of campers and targeted interventions thereof. Data management of the performance evaluations be ensured.
 - 4.3 Maintaining a proper system of utilisation of Government grants under the scheme.
 - 4.4 Displaying of grants received through the scheme on website of BFI.
 - 4.5 Strict compliance of WADA Code and NADA rules, details of educational plans for athletes and display of Anti-Doping awareness programmes on their respective websites.
- 5. The calendar and budget were considered and approved with modifications pursuant to deliberations. The total budget of ACTC was approved for BFI up to March, 2023 with a cap of **Rs. 3.50 Cr.,** of this, 10% is earmarked for contingencies and 3% for administrative expenses of the NSF as per the latest norms of MYAS dated 28th February 2022. NSF should ensure that all the needs of athletes as projected under ACTC is fulfilled.
- 6. The budget is approved for the following requirements:
 - 6.1 National Coaching Camp (Senior)

Placed at Annexure – II (Senior Men) & III (Senior Women).

6.2 International Competition (Senior & Juniors)

Foreign Exposure in all age groups and across all events should be with a focused approach on targeted events with commensurate exposures to the Junior Group. *Placed at Annexure – IV (Senior) & V (Junior)*

6.3 International Competition in India

6.4 Domestic Competitions

Placed at Annexure – VII.

6.5 Remuneration - Foreign Coaches & Support Staff

Indian coaches should be provided with proper training during the tenure of Foreign Coach so that Indian coaches are also groomed and dependence on foreign coaches gets reduced. The overall expenditure of foreign coaches & support staff not to exceed 30% of the total budget sanctioned under ACTC. Placed at Annexure – VIII.

6.6 Remuneration - Indian Coaches

The names and salaries of the coaches and support staff to be empanelled for the National Coaching Camp shall be approved separately by the Empanelment Committee by 30.04.2022. Placed at *Annexure – IX*.

6.7 Equipment (Consumables & Non-Consumables)

The NSF to procure equipment as per circular of MYAS. Placed at Annexure - X.

- 7. The proposed ACTC is approved within the approved budgetary ceiling as stated at Para 5. A review would be undertaken after Asian Games 2022, in the month of October 2022, for any additional requirement of funds subject to availability of budget under the 'Assistance to NSF' Scheme.
- 8. Modifications to the calendar can be made by NSF with the approval by DG SAI within the overall approved budget. It was reiterated that all the guidelines mentioned in MYAS circular dated 28th Feb, 2022 will be adhered to.
- 9. Secretary (Sports) emphasised on the following aspects:
 - a. Alternate training and competition plans should be prepared to cater for any possible further outbreaks of COVID 19. Also, strict protocols should be put in place to avoid COVID 19 infections during training.
 - b. BFI should also identify Basketball Centers to nurture grassroots talent & broad base the sport in collaboration with SAI.
 - c. BFI should finalize their selection policy, which would be notified on their website.
 - d. Department of sports would grant necessary sanction for Coach, Referee & Judge development under HRDS.

10. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
