

- 3. DG SAI, directed to review the performance of both the Foreign Coaches to continue their services within 3 months.
- 4. DG SAI, suggested to plan Domestic League Structure for the development of Players' performance in preparation for International Competitions. He also stated that there should be a strong Domestic Competition Structure in all Age categories, so that players can get more domestic competition exposure for their playing experience.
- 5. Thereafter, ACTC 2021-22 proposal for the discipline of Basketball was taken up for consideration and total budget of Rs. 3.01 Cr. was approved for BFI up to March, 2022 with an expenditure ceiling of **Rs. 3.00 Cr.:**
