BFI Selection Policy

1. Vision of the Policy

The BFI envisions creating a **structured**, **long-term talent development system** aligned with upcoming major international events, including the **Asian Games**, **Commonwealth Games**, and **Olympics**. This vision is supported by:

- A sustainable athlete pool across U16, U18/U19, and Senior levels.
- Transparent, merit-based selection processes that reflect national standards.
- Integration of multiple competition platforms to widen the talent base.

2. National Championships as Core Pathway

The National Basketball Championships, conducted annually across these age categories:

- Sub-Junior
- Youth
- Junior
- Senior

3. Expanded Athlete Selection Ecosystem

In addition to the National Championships, talent may also be scouted from:

- Indian National Basketball League (INBL)
- National Star Basketball League (NSBL)
- **BFI-endorsed Zonal Tournaments** This ensures players from diverse performance ecosystems are included in the selection pipeline.

4. Age Verification & Integrity Standards

- All selected players must undergo **age verification** (Aadhaar, educational documents, or bone-age testing as needed).
- **Penalties for Age Fraud**: Any proven case will result in **immediate disqualification**, **ban for a defined period (e.g., 2 years)**, and **bar from future participation** in BFI events.



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5. Player Selection Process

Step 1: Selection Committee Constitution

A committee of basketball experts is appointed by BFI, comprising:

- Former International Players
- National Awardees
- Head and Assistant Coaches of National Teams
- Other Technical Experts as nominated

Step 2: Shortlisting & Camp Invitations

- Evaluation of athletes from national tournaments and leagues.
- Top 30 players per category are invited to National Training and Selection Camps.

Step 3: Final Team Selection

Players are assessed on:

- Skill & Tactical Understanding
- Fitness & Physical Readiness
- Positional Requirements
- Match Impact
- Development Potential

6. Eligibility for Selection

To be considered, an athlete must:

- Submit complete documentation as per BFI circulars.
- Hold a valid Indian passport.
- Be a player of good standing (ethics, team conduct, and commitment).
- Comply with **BFI rules**, regulations, and anti-doping norms.

7. Selection Criteria

The following are assessed during camps and preparatory games:

- Technical & Tactical Skill
- Game IQ & Positional Play



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- Fitness & Recovery Capability
- On-court Impact
- Consistency & Growth Potential
- Adaptability to Team Strategies

8. Continuity Across Age-Groups

To ensure long-term athlete development and a stable national talent pipeline:

- **Minimum of 40% overlap** in athlete pools will be maintained between the following categories:
 - **U16 and U18**
 - U18 and Senior National Teams
- The identified athletes forming part of this continuous pool shall be **admitted to the BFI National Academy**, where they will undergo **year-round residential training** (**365 days**) under expert supervision.
- These athletes will receive **technical**, **tactical**, **physical**, **psychological**, **and academic support**, positioning them for seamless integration into higher national team levels.
- This structured continuity:
 - Facilitates **smooth transitions** between age categories
 - Enhances team cohesion and identity
 - Supports long-term preparation for international events

9. Selection Committee Structure & Tenure

Composition

- 1. Mr. Shakti Sinh Gohil Chairman, Selection Committee
- 2. Mr. Scott William Flemming Head Coach, Indian Men's National Team
- 3. Mr. Bhaskar S Head Coach, Indian Women's National Team
- 4. Assistant Coaches Men's & Women's National Teams
- 5. Panel of Former International Players & National Awardees

To enhance the **efficiency**, **transparency**, and **long-term strategic impact** of the selection process, the following structural reforms are proposed:

Continuity Across Age Groups

Ensure a **minimum of 60% continuity** in Selection Committee membership across different age-group panels (Sub-Junior, Youth, Junior, and Senior). This continuity will:



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- Preserve institutional knowledge,
- Enable **consistent athlete tracking**, and
- Promote **alignment in selection philosophy** across the development pathway.

Diverse & Inclusive Composition

Expand the Selection Committee to include a **broader and more representative mix** of expertise, such as:

- Grassroots and academy-level coaches from both public and private sectors,
- Foreign coaching experts, including Head Coaches and Technical Directors,
- Player development professionals, including sports scientists and performance analysts.

This diversity ensures balanced decision-making and integration of modern highperformance practices.

Defined Tenure and Member Rotation

- Define the **standard tenure** of Selection Committee members as **two years**, with the possibility of a **two-year extension** based on contribution and effectiveness.
- During committee transitions, ensure that **at least 60% of members are retained** to maintain continuity in:
 - Athlete evaluation and monitoring
 - Team-building strategies
 - High-performance development goals

These reforms aim to establish a **dynamic**, **stable**, **and visionary committee structure**, combining **experience**, **innovation**, and a **long-term commitment to Indian basketball's international success**.

10. Expectations of the Selection Committee

- Fairness & Transparency: Ensure selection based strictly on merit and adherence to criteria.
- **Eligibility Enforcement**: Select only players meeting all documentation and conduct standards.
- **Deadline Compliance**: Complete selections within fixed timelines.
- **Confidential Communication**: Non-selected players to be informed respectfully and privately.
- **Appeals & Clarifications**: Provide opportunity for private explanation upon player request.



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11. Expectations of Players

Players are expected to:

- Maintain Performance & Match Readiness
- **Be Reliable**: Avoid late arrivals or unjustified absences.
- **Uphold Team Spirit**: Support teammates, coaches, and logistics even when not playing.
- **Respect Training Discipline**: Inform in advance if unable to attend sessions.
- Provide Constructive Feedback: Raise concerns through respectful channels.

12. Expectations of Coaching Staff

Coaches are responsible for:

- Holding Valid Accreditation
- Delivering Quality Training: Sessions must emphasize fitness, skill, and strategy.
- Offering Technical Guidance
- Communicating Constructively
- Managing Non-selection with Sensitivity
- Supporting Injured Players: Liaise for timely rehab and reintegration.

The Basketball Federation of India is committed to maintaining a fair, transparent, and meritbased selection process at all levels, with the goal of achieving strong and consistent performances on the international stage.
